

When **Cambodia** was young, she was rich and her abundance (the rice produce) would flow into surrounding nations. Bad things started happen to her. She was robbed, the major rice- produce land were taken away by two of the neighboring countries; then she was raped, an aggressive party tried to dominate and take over the control, killed 3.2 million people in four years, among those killed were mostly highly educated people and their relatives. Very soon, Cambodia became one of the poorest countries among her neighbors. Today, besides Phnom Pam the capital city, the rest of the nation has either no electricity or using generators for very basic needs. There were little banks exist because there are few trust worthy banker that has the integrity to hold business. Poverty and chaos spread out even across the street from the King's Palace.

Even in such desperation, God has not forgotten Cambodia. The new King and his cabinet started seeking ways to rebuild the country. Three years ago, they met Apostle Mark Geppert, founder of South East Asia Prayer Center while he was leading prayer walk seminar in the city. The Secretary of State mentioned about the great need of education in the country. Out of the conversation, a formal plan was proposed later on by a retired US school district superintendent, and approved by the King, in that 25 Christian schools, including secondary schools and orphanages, will be built and fully function to raise the whole next generation in the nation.
